Senior Living Categories

Independent Living:
Independent living refers to any housing arrangement designed exclusively for older adults, generally those aged 55 and over. Housing varies widely, from apartment-style living to single-family detached homes. In general, the housing is friendlier to aging adults, often being more compact, with easier navigation and no maintenance or yard work to worry about. While residents live independently, most communities offer additional amenities, activities, and services.

Assisted Living:
Assisted Living provides support for individuals who need some assistance, but want to remain as independent as possible. Although an Assisted Living community and a Nursing Home (or Skilled Nursing Facility) are both forms of long-term care, they have many differences including the level of care, amenities and style of apartments offered.

Memory Care:
Memory care communities share many of the same features of assisted living facilities including apartment-style living, common areas, and communal meals. But memory care offers a more specialized form of assisted living customized to meet the needs of those diagnosed with Alzheimer's disease or related dementia.

Living At Home
At this stage we can help assess needs to safely keep you at home by developing a plan for long term needs such as:

In home care services: these are services that daily living support that do not require a licensed healthcare professional. They include activities like: laundry, shopping, cooking, cleaning, companionship.

In home health services: these are services that include medical care that must be performed by a licensed healthcare professional. They include things like: physical therapy, medication management, wound care, transportation.
